Fairfield County Community Foundation assists TAG

Greenwich seniors, the disabled and those undergoing medical care will continue to receive vital transportation services with the help of a recent \$5,000 challenge grant from the Fairfield County Community Foundation.

The Transportation Association of Greenwich (TAG) received the grant from the Community Foundation after a unique and successful spring appeal reached the matching threshold.

“We are most appreciative of this generous and timely support from FCCF,” said Richard A. Muskus, Jr. President of the Board of TAG. “TAG provides critical services helping our senior and disabled residents remain active and providing critical access to medical, social and other important services.”

Created in 1984, TAG provides free or low-rate transportation services to Greenwich residents in need. Among the services offered are rides to medical treatments through the Red Cross Motor Service, trips to and from the Senior Center, Dial-A-Ride services for seniors and the disabled throughout lower Fairfield and nearby Westchester counties and Greenwich Commuter Shuttles. Easy Access, an affordable door-to-door service, helps disabled residents travel beyond the borders of town along the Post Road in Greenwich, Stamford, Darien and Norwalk.

The Fairfield County Community Foundation was formed in 1992 and has provided grants to not for profits throughout Fairfield County in excess of \$123 million. TAG is a not for profit organization serving the transportation needs of seniors, disabled adults and children along with other not for profits since 1984.
